- → An honest reflection on problems encountered and their solutions
- └→ Recording of conversations, contacts, readings and sources of secondary data
- └→ Reflects a proposed timeline
- → To be located in the Appendix section of the report

### The completed product or report 15%

- $\mapsto$  Is independent, the student's own work
- └→ Is research based
- → Reflects time and commitment allocated in the overall context of the course

Stages in the development of the Independent Research Project:

- Determine an area of interest
- > Develop a focus question or hypothesis
- Select appropriate research methodology
- Prepare a project plan indicating sequence/timeframe for task completion
- Collecting and recording data
- Analyse and interpret data
- Constructing a bibliography and appendix
- Evaluation of process, commenting on experience from research process and forming suggestions for further research
